Thursday, February 3, Zdeno Mayercak “My Journey – Five Decades of Wood Carving”

Get ready to begin the new year by learning about an art form you may know little about! Please join us as we welcome Professor Zdeno Mayercak as he discusses creating sculpture by carving wood and stone. He will even do a short demo of his methods learned over 5 decades. We are certain to come away with an appreciation of what it takes to transform a natural object into a work of art.

Zdeno Mayercak studied Wood Carving at School of Fine Arts, Bratislava, Slovakia, and Figure Sculpture at Academy of Fine Arts, Bratislava, where he received his MFA in sculpture. He also studied at the Academy of Fine Arts, Rome, Italy, under Prof. Lorenzo Guerrini. Zdeno came to the United States as a political refugee in 1985. He is currently teaching at Montgomery College where he is Sculpture Coordinator. He also exhibits his work internationally.

Lost, Found, and Looking Forward
March 2022

Deadline for entries: Friday, February 18

The Rockville Art League and the City of Rockville are hosting an art exhibit to complement a premiere performance by the Rockville Concert Band at the F. Scott Fitzgerald Theatre of an original commissioned concert piece created by world-renowned composer Johan de Meij to honor those lost to COVID and offer a breath of hope as we head to the future. This concert will be on Sunday, March 13.

RAL *members in good standing* will be allowed to submit original works, *up to 3 pieces of art for consideration* for an in person and online show to be exhibited beginning March 2022 at Glenview.

The theme of this art exhibit ***Lost, Found, and Looking Forward*** is the pandemic and the hope for the aftermath. We are looking for artwork that would capture an element of the unique times of March 2020 until now, and as we look ahead: what we ***Lost***, what we ***Found*** and our hope as we are ***Looking Forward***.

From the lockdown to loss, from isolation to resilience, discovery, solace, appreciation for one another and nature, and moving forward towards brighter days ahead, we look forward to your creations and your interpretations of this concept. Each member may submit up to 3 pieces.

The work may be newly created but you may also submit a piece you have created during the

pandemic (*or earlier*) * in the following mediums: (*It also may have been exhibited in a prior show).

- oils/acrylics
- watercolors
- drawings, pastels, hand-pulled prints
- mixed media, collage, experimental
- photography
- sculpture

All 2-D pieces will need to be framed, gallery-wrapped or professionally finished, securely wired, ready for hanging with the *maximum* measurement of any framed side of 48 inches. If submitting unfamed work, the edges should be painted or finished. No wet paint. Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted. RAL retains the right to determine the suitability of the work for entry in this show.

To submit work, please use your personal link that was sent to you to enter your work for the RAL Juried Members’ Winter Show. When you submit work, you will need to complete the following for each of your pieces (up to 3 entries): artwork title, medium, market price only (if NFS, please leave blank), clear image (jpg.) of your artwork, and dimensions.

Show agreement You will need to agree to the following before your work can be exhibited: “I agree to the exhibition dates as listed below, that my entries are my original works, and I will not hold the Rockville Art League, Glenview Mansion, or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries while on the Rockville Civic Center Park property. I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in handling my entries. I give RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to photograph my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during this show at Glenview to the City of Rockville.”

Schedule:

Friday, February 18: deadline for all submissions.

Friday, March 4: notifications sent out

Sunday, March 13: prize-winning art will be displayed at the F. Scott Fitzgerald Theatre during the concert.

Monday, March 14: drop off artwork, Glenview Mansion, 10:00am-1:00pm.

Sunday, March 20: “Meet the Artists” opening at Glenview. 1:30-3:30pm (optional)

Monday, May 9: pick up of artwork 10:00am-1:00pm.

Prizes of recognition will be awarded by the *City of Rockville*. The *prize-winning work* will be displayed the *afternoon of the premiere* at the F. Scott Fitzgerald Theatre and the entire art show will be exhibited in person at Glenview Mansion the following week. Additionally, the virtual show will be shown on the RAL website as well as the City of Rockville’s.

Deadline for submissions: Friday, February 18.

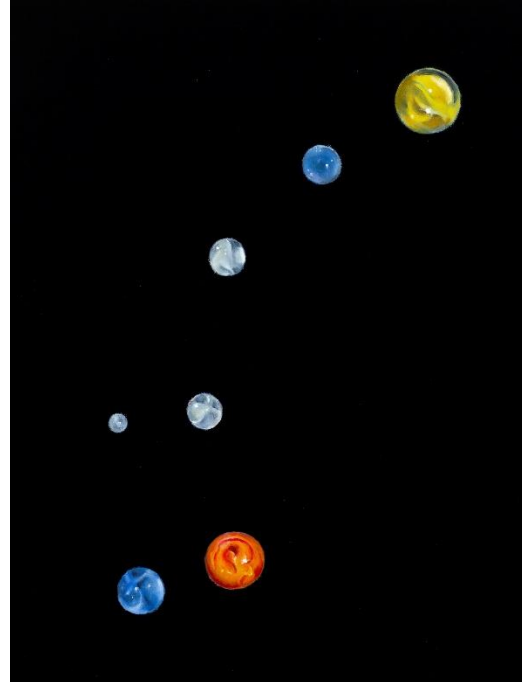

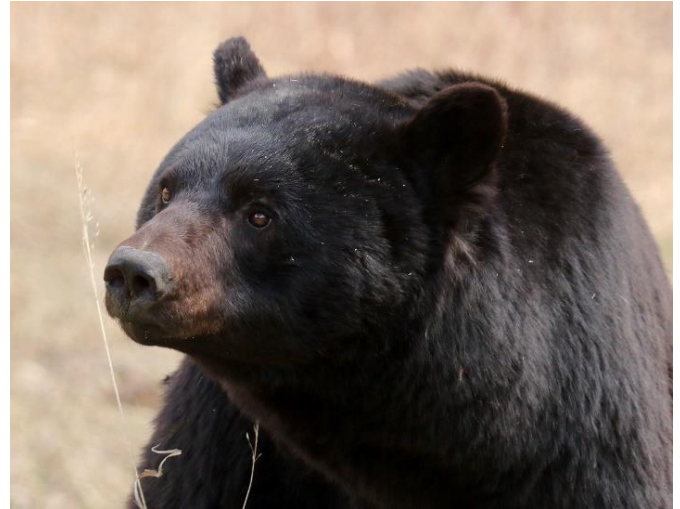
