Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Dear Rockville Art League Artists,

One of my favorite art quotes is by Edgar Degas... “Art is not what you see, but what you make others see.”

And spring, it appears, is when we RAL artists are set to help many people see!

We do that through the many shows and exhibitions in which you participate, including those sponsored by our league. Our Members’ Spring Juried Show is just around the corner, and it will be followed by our “Essence of Summer” sponsored by RAL and the City of Rockville. More on the spring juried show is included later in the newsletter.

Spring is a time of new and renew. Warmer temperatures encourage us to get out and about (and hopefully create art). Our spirits are lifted, and we are energized by fresh opportunities. Most everyone likes “new.”

While new is something to be envied it comes at a price. New affects the existing and people do not always have the same positive feelings when the words “different” and “change” are used.

Change requires openness to the different and, the bigger and more important the change is, the more difficult that change may be to embrace.

As we emerge from the pandemic that has haunted us for three years, I am very encouraged by the change we have seen and the work of so many including the many artists in our group. We have embraced virtual, new processes and technology, and most of us have done so with a positive outlook and enviable creativity.

I recommend that you read 9th *Street Women* by Mary Gabriel. It chronicles five women artists who dared to challenge the world of art and they made a dramatic impact on twentieth-century art, specifically “abstract” painting. They took on the male dominated, European driven art establishment and helped make the USA the center of the art world. And they did this during turbulent social and political times...the Great Depression and World War II.

Abstract art is different from the art I grew up with and it requires skills that I don’t believe I possess.

It is new and different for me and a bit frightening.

And I certainly appreciate the women described in this book. Their courage, commitment, and the risks they took to be different is inspiring. And the more I learn about them and their genre, the more I like their work. Plus, new (to me) and different doesn't necessarily take away from the existing and beloved.

"People will never understand what we are doing if they can't feel. All art is abstract. But it's all real... We were all trying to bring that spirit that spontaneous energy, into our work."

We have a many terrific abstract artists in our league and fortunately the number seems to be growing.

Artists, I believe, are more open to new, even the scary stuff of "different" and "change." Thank you again for your support during these times of change and for keeping art active and alive in Montgomery County.

Heartfelt thanks to master artist and Compass Atelier founder Glen Kessler for the outstanding portrait demonstration he gave us in early February.

We had a strong turnout present for the Zoom. Several of you commented on the issue we had with the Zoom recording. We heard Glen discussing his color mixing but missed seeing it (we saw the model's image instead). Fortunately, if you stay with the recording you will be able to see Glen compose and paint the actual portrait...it is worth the wait.

On March 2nd, we will welcome art historian Erich Keel as he presents "The Path to Fauvism: Matisse and Derain in the South of France." More on Erich is included later in this newsletter.

Erich Keel on *The Path to Fauvism: Matisse and Derain in the South of France*

Some art historians find the seeds of Fauvism in 1892 when Henri Matisse became a pupil of the famous Symbolist painter Gustave Moreau. Others point to the studio of Eugène Carrière, another Symbolist, where Matisse first met André Derain in 1900. Both were ambitious students, both were experimenting with color, as were others who would later be called Fauves. But it was in summer 1905, when Matisse and Derain worked in Collioure, a small fishing village on the Mediterranean coast, near the Spanish border, that the idea of painting with

pure color was fully realized. The purpose of the talk is to follow the path of these two highly gifted artists to Fauvism, a new way of painting landscapes, portraits, and literary subjects.

Erich Keel was born and raised in Zurich, Switzerland. He served as the Kreeger Museum's Head of Education from 1999 to 2013. Keel graduated from Emory University with a dissertation on the French philosopher Maurice Merleau-Ponty. Since the fall of 2008, he has been curating shows for the Arts Club of Washington. His current studies focus on selected themes in European art and history, including Germany, France, and Italy.

Glen Kessler *Efficient Portrait Painting: How to Paint a Portrait Quickly and Accurately on Feb. 2*

It was an honor to have the internationally collected artist and founder of The Compass Atelier, Glen Kessler, demonstrate for Rockville Art League members a method to create a quick yet accurate portrait painting on Thursday, Feb. 2. Glen shared some of his easy-to-learn methods that can be learned over time and took

the viewers through the entire painting process in just 90 minutes. It was quite a mesmerizing and lively evening as we witnessed a master artist *race against the clock* to create a wonderful portrait.

Thank you everyone who joined us! It was an excellent turnout. A BIG THANK YOU to GLEN KESSLER for sharing his process with us!

For those of you who couldn't join us that evening, a video was sent out to all members. Since Glen was using 3 cameras for an effective demonstration, his camera to show him color mixing couldn't be seen on the recording but if you watch further into the video, you will see him paint the portrait.

Here is the finished product and it is quite a beautiful portrait.

Call for entries: Tuesday, April 11. *Online submissions only.*

Judge: We are honored that Glen Echo resident artist and educator J. Jordan Bruns will judge our *Rockville Art League Juried Members' Spring Show*. Members will remember his engaging presentation in November about his work and the influence of his sabbatical in Japan.

J. Jordan Bruns is a full-time artist living and working in Maryland and a Glen Echo Park resident artist working in the Chautauqua Tower. He recently returned from a three-year sabbatical in Tokyo, Japan (2018-2021) where much of his current aesthetic influences stem from. In 2004, he received BFAs in Painting and Illustration at Maryland Institute College of Art. He then went on to earn an MFA in Studio Painting at Indiana University in 2007. After grad school, he instructed at and managed the *Yellow Barn Studio and Gallery*, at Glen Echo Park in Maryland. His love of teaching has led him to branch out and become Director of *Art Clinic*, a painting and drawing school at Glen Echo Park, Maryland in 2022. His artwork is in the public collections of Novartis Pharmaceuticals and Kaiser Permanente. Solo exhibitions include Long View Gallery (Washington, DC) and The Indiana University Art Museum (Bloomington, Indiana). His numerous group shows include "Transient Geometries" at The Antelope Valley College Art Gallery (Lancaster, California) and "Color Schooled" (Long View Gallery, Washington, DC). His work has also been exhibited in Scope Miami in 2014, Context Miami in 2017 and 2018 as well as Aqua Miami in 2019 during Art Basel.

On Exhibit: This juried show will be on display in person at **Glenview Mansion Art Gallery** (603 Edmonston Dr./Rockville) with the virtual show available on our website. J. Jordan Bruns will award prizes on **Sunday, May 21, 2:00pm at Glenview**. A pre-recorded zoom of him discussing awards choices will be sent out the week afterwards.

Call Deadline: *Members in good standing* may submit up to **two (2) pieces** of work to be considered by the judge for inclusion in this show **by TUESDAY, April 11**. No submissions will be accepted after the deadline. *If your work is accepted into this show, you will be informed by Monday, April 24. Please read all the information below carefully.*

Entry Fee: A flat \$10 show fee will be collected from **artists who have their work accepted into this show** (not per piece).

IMPORTANT! By submitting work into this show, you are agreeing to the terms of the **Show Agreement** listed here:

“I agree to the rules of the show as presented in this show call and the schedule below, that my entries are my original works and have not been accepted into a previous Rockville Art League Juried Members’ Show. I will not hold the Rockville Art League (RAL), Glenview Mansion, or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries. As with any show, I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in the handling of my artwork. I give RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to use images of my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during this show at Glenview to the City of Rockville.”

Eligibility and rules: The following rules apply for all works entered.

- Each *member in good standing* may enter **up to two pieces by the deadline**.
- **How to enter:** submit your entries using your **PERSONAL LINK and PASSWORD** that was emailed to you when you renewed this year. Submissions of **up to 2 pieces per artist for consideration** by the judge will be accepted by **Tuesday, April 11**.
- For each submission you will be required to include: the **title, medium, dimensions** (note: depth is for sculpture only) and **market price** (NOT wholesale price!) (If Not for Sale, please leave blank and you will be contacted to confirm this) and **submit an image** (jpeg or jpg.) of your piece. The mat or the frame (or glass, glare, wall, furniture etc.) should NOT be visible in the image you submit. Just the artwork itself.
- **If your work is accepted into this show:** a \$10 show fee per artist (not per piece) will be collected at that time.
- RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show.

Artwork requirements: If your work is accepted into this show, *each 2-D piece must be ready for hanging*, gallery-wrapped or framed or professionally finished, **securely wired** by May 16.

- The maximum measurement of any framed side is **48 inches**.
- Only **original** works **framed securely with hanging wire** are acceptable. (NO sawtooth hangers or such.) If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished.
- **NO wet canvases** are allowed.
- The **entries may not have been exhibited** previously in a ***RAL Juried Members’ Show***. All artists are encouraged to sign their work on either the front or back.
- Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted.
- All work must remain up until the end of the show.
- **Sales:** If any work sells while on display at Glenview, the artist agrees to donate 20% of the

sales price to the City of Rockville as specified in the *Show Agreement* above.

Categories of Artwork Include:

- Oils and acrylics
- Watercolors
- Pastels, drawings, and hand-pulled prints
- Mixed media, collage, experimental, and original computer-generated art
- Photographs
- Sculpture and ceramics

Awards:

- Best in Show (cash prize)
- First, Second, Third in all categories (cash prizes)
- Honorable Mention at Judge's Discretion

Schedule:

- **Tuesday, April 11 - deadline for all submissions** - online submissions (up to 2 pieces per artist)
- **Monday, April 24** – notifications of acceptances sent out to all members by this date
- **TUESDAY, May 16**– *delivery of accepted artwork* at Glenview, **10:00am-1:00pm**; if your work is accepted into this show, you or your designee must deliver your work during this time. The judge will award prizes based on an in-person view.
- **Sunday, May 21, 1:30-3:30pm, Meet the Artists Opening** at Glenview Mansion. J. Jordan Bruns will **award prizes at 2:00pm** with remarks about the work. He will also be available throughout the afternoon to talk with artists.
- **Week of May 22:** A pre-recorded zoom video of the judge discussing his awards choices will be sent out to all members.
- **Monday, June 26 - pick up artwork** 10:00am-1:00pm

Please note: *Members in good standing* have been emailed their personal link. It is the same one you used to enter shows this year. *If you paid your dues for Sept. 1, 2022 – Aug. 31, 2023, you are a member in good standing.*

PLEASE: *if you are unsure of your membership status*, ask us! If you cannot find your link, please ask. Use your personal link/password to enter your work in the show. Be sure to type in all information carefully and clearly.

This information will be used to contact you and to create the virtual show and the labels.

If you need help, **please ask ahead of the deadline!**

You may enter work for this show now through Tuesday, April 11.

Deadline for all entries is **Tuesday, April 11.**

Notifications of acceptance will be sent out to all members by April 24. It will be also posted on the Rockville Art League website.

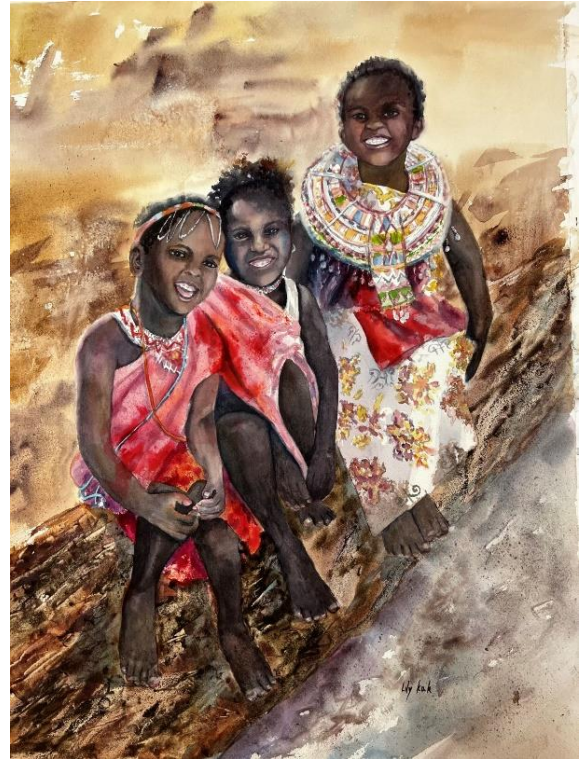

Please name your file as follows: Last nameFirstName-TitleofArtwork-Entry#. Example: SmithTom-Sunrise1.jpg. All work must be original and signed by the artist. Photographs and digital manipulations are considered original. All work must have been created within the last three years. Work previously juried into a CHAL exhibit may not be submitted. Previously non-accepted work may be submitted. Submission opens January 14, 2023 - **closes February 19, 2023, at midnight. Entry Fees: Non-members may submit 3 entries for a non-refundable fee of \$35.00.** CHAL members' discounted fee is \$25; a special discount code will be sent to our members for their discount. Up to two additional entries may be submitted at \$5 each for members and non- members. Artists submitting 3- dimensional work may provide two images of each piece, front view and side view. 


