September's Speaker: Claudia Olivos



Claudia Olivos, an accomplished artist and teacher in the Washington, D.C. area will be our September speaker. She exhibits her work nationally and internationally; her paintings have been featured in several publications including the cover of *Coming Home* by J. Pizarro, CD, *Octaves Beyond Silence* featuring Eve Ensler and Indigo Girls, a CD which benefitted women survivors of violence in Rwanda, Bosnia & Afghanistan, as well as several books of Latino Poetry and novels.

Claudia has been involved in the local art scene with various projects—from working with at-risk youth, to teaching at Washington DC metro area venues which includes ten years as adjunct faculty at the Art Institute of Washington, Smithsonian Institution Resident Associates Program, the Art League of Alexandria, Hirshhorn Museum, leading workshops in the community. She has been the resident artist--often painting backdrops for scenery—for Teatro de La Luna, a local Latino theater.

Born in Washington, DC, to Chilean parents, Claudia was raised in Chile where she was witness to the political upheaval of the Allende-Pinochet years. Her family returned to the U.S. when she was twelve years old. Claudia holds an MFA from Vermont College where her thesis focused on Magical Realism in visual arts. Claudia resides in Arlington, Virginia, with her son, Julian, and her partner, fellow artist, Sergio Olivos, where they share a working studio for creating their own work, and leading art workshops for individuals of all ages. Critique by Penny Kritt

Making Great Shapes

If *you* would like a critique, please email a photo to me at <u>pennykritt@aol.com</u>. Perhaps your work will be chosen for the next issue.

Both painting and drawing rely on the artist's ability to create interesting shapes. If abstract art is your thing, your shapes don't have to mirror reality, but they still need to create a response from the viewer. Maybe you're aiming for curiosity (why is that blue rectangle *there*?) or shock value (is that a stuffed animal pushed into a garbage disposal?). Even in abstracts, you can create a mood (isn't it a serene composition, kind of reminds me of a glorious sunset).

The stakes are even higher if you prefer realism. In that case, you might want the viewer to recognize the Washington Monument or that famous sneer of Elvis Presley. In that case, close just isn't good enough.

Well, take heart! It's easier than you might think. There are only three things to get right.

Make Great Shapes: First, break things down into individual shapes. Make a person's cheeks a little too wide and you just made them gain 10 pounds. Give your tulips short stems with round leaves and they'll just look wrong. If you're working from a photo, you can always trace your shapes and then enlarge the whole thing if necessary. And it's easier if you do a larger, irregular shape. Instead of painting each tree in the forest, make a more interesting "forest" shape instead of all those separate tree shapes.

Value and Variety: Next, each shape has to be the right value. Your choices are lights, mid tones and darks. The most common problem is that the entire piece is all mid tones – grays or all pastel colors. It might be serene, but it will probably also be really boring. Choose one to predominate, a lot less of the second value and then a little of the third. Now you've got the tools to build some interesting contrast.

How to Get from Here to There: And finally, recreate how one shape transitions into the next. There, that's it. That's all you have to do! Let's look at a photo of a bubbling fountain in a garden pool.

We'll start with a black and white photo as a reference.



Making great shapes:

If the flower pots on the right were square boxes instead of curvilinear forms, this would be a far less interesting composition. Their rounded forms make a nice contrast to how straight the stairs and the edge of the pond are. These pots cut off the stairs and are obviously in the water. That gives the composition a sense of depth because the stairs are clearly behind the pond. And it's more interesting that the flower pots were cut off by the right margin.

Getting the right value for each shape:

Next, the value has to be right. Value relates to how light or dark a shape/color is. For example, a soft powder blue is a light value, equal to a light gray in a black and white photo. The red on a can of Coca Cola is a mid tone. And a color like midnight blue is a dark.

When your values are wrong, it says that it's a different time of day, the wrong weather conditions or type of light. In the photo above, the light value on horizontal part of the stairs says bright sun, especially it's next to the dark one that shows the vertical part of each step in shadow. Now look below at the stairs that are changed to a midtone.

Now it's either a cloudy day or earlier in the morning.

If your artwork is just plain boring, the most likely cause is a lack of value contrast. Imagine your work as a black and white photocopy. If it's all grays without enough contrasting lights and darks, at least add some different kinds of shapes, preferably in your center of interest.



Edges matter:

Every shape has hard edges shown by 1 below. That means you can tell exactly where one shape stops and the next one starts. Hard edges don't have to be straight or level as they are here but there will be a distinct difference between one value and the next.



When there's a gradual change as in 2 above, that's called a soft edge. The reflection of light on the right pot gradually becomes darker, and that shows that the pot is round and three dimensional. It also tells the viewer that the pot on the right is in front of the other pot. If you use masking fluid to save the white in the sparkle of the water, it may not look realistic. That's because masking fluid leaves very hard edges that may be too stark. Just take a damp brush and lightly soften the transition between the light reflections and the dark water.

Lost edges shown by 3 blur things and give a sense of mystery. It's not clear where the pot ends and the water begins. Although the pot is dark brown and the water is black, that detail isn't important.

Adding color is easy once you understand that getting the value and edges of each shape is the critical part. I guarantee it – if your painting doesn't look right, your shapes are the wrong value or the transition is wrong.

Montgomery Art Association's Labor Day Weekend Paint the Town Art Show 2014

Judged Art Exhibit at the Kensington Armory 3710 Mitchell Street, Kensington, MD 20895

This art event includes a 3-day Art Exhibit and sale (August 30 – September 1) and a Plein Air painting contest open to both adults and children on Saturday, August 30.

Art Exhibit

Eligibility: Artists must be aged 18 and older. One work must be based on a subject within the 20895 zip code of Kensington (abstract interpretations ok). Other works can be of subjects the artist selects. Original works only – securely framed and ready for hanging with wires (no brackets/sawtooths). Works larger than 20" x 28" should use plexiglass glazing if needed. No wet canvases. Work should have been completed within the last two years and no work will be accepted that has been exhibited in any previously judged MAA show.

The "hand of the artist" must be visible and dominant in constructing the artwork even if digital tools are used. If a digital piece is not "one of a kind," the piece should be numbered as with a limited edition. Photography is not accepted. Tastefully-done nudes (no explicit views) are permitted. The judge and/or show committee reserves the right to reject inappropriate works. Artwork is hung on a space-available basis; only works following stated guidelines will be hung.

Bin Work and Card Sales: Accepted for MAA members with work in the show. If work for bin is 5 pieces or more, you must bring your own bin.

Entry Fees: Non-refundable \$35 fee (Non-members) / \$13 (MAA members) to cover the cost of the Kensington entry and one additional entry. MAA membership dues expire before the show, and MAA membership renewal (\$40) must accompany show registration to receive reduced show entry fees. Additional works may be submitted for \$9 per entry (non-members) / \$6 per entry (MAA members).

<u>Subject Categories</u>: Kensington Category – one entry mandatory. The other Categories are: Landscape; Portrait (People and Animals); Still Life; Abstract and 3D. The artist should specify the category desired for each piece entered in addition to the Kensington-related piece.

Awards: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention awards are given for each of the categories listed. The first prize winner in the Kensington category, the piece that best represents the ambience and spirit of Kensington, receives the Bertha Clum Award, the most prestigious of the awards given. Monetary awards, gift certificates and prizes are generous donations of merchants and businesses & the Town of Kensington.

Delivery Dates and Times: Thursday, August 28th, 5:00 – 7:00 pm and Friday, August 29th, 10:00 am – noon (Judging starts at noon, August 29th.). Make sure each piece has a label on the Back Top Right of Frame that identifies the Artist, Title, Category, and Price.

Reception & Awards Presentation: Saturday, August 30th, 6:00 – 7:30 pm Awards Presentation begins at 6:45 pm.

Pick Up Unsold Art: Tuesday, September 2, from 9:00 am - noon

<u>Sales:</u> MAA will manage sales, collect MD sales tax, and take 25% commission from artist's price. Works that sell are not to be removed until the end of the show, Monday, September 1, 5:30 – 6:00 pm.

<u>Security:</u> Reasonable care and security will be given by MAA and its volunteers. Volunteers, MAA, and the Town of Kensington will not be responsible for loss or damage to artwork on the property. Artists are advised to have their own insurance.

GLENVIEW MANSION CONFERENCE ROOM SHOWS

You can show your artwork in Glenview Mansion for one month if you have received a 1st, 2nd, 3rd or honorable mention award in an RAL juried show. Starting in 2013, artists may have both rooms to exhibit in if a second artist doesn't sign up for the same month within two months of the show's start date; otherwise they will have one room. The receptions at Glenview mansion are 1:30-3:30 pm, on the Sunday after hanging! Preferred drop-off and pick-up times for Glenview Shows are from 9 am to 12 noon. Note: please contact the mansion management ahead of time if you wish to modify the drop-off or pick-up times.

For artwork delivery at the Glenview Mansion, please be prepared to unwrap your work and take the wrappings with you - there is no room to store packing materials at the Mansion. Please bring pliers (needle nose are easy to work with). There is no one to help move artwork from your vehicle to the conference rooms, however, you may use the hand truck that is at the Mansion. You are responsible for hanging your own artwork with help from the Mansion staff. If you have not made labels for your work, please fill out the RAL cards that will be available when you bring your work to the conference room. If you print your own, they should be on card stock. Please do not use the sticky Avery labels, unless you adhere them to foam core or card stock.

If you are unavailable on the appropriate date for pickup, please arrange with someone to pickup for you. There is no room to store your artwork at the Mansion after it comes down.

Please note that in 2014, drop off/pickup switches from Wednesdays to Mondays (unless Monday is a holiday).
