Message from the President Fred Ruckdeschel

Dear fellow artists and art lovers,



The winter has posed a difficult time for me. My need or desire to work on collages waned. Partly, I was not outside enough; the lack of sun many days, not the cold, reduces inordinately my desire for fresh air. And my high-intensity lamp at breakfast is only a fair substitute.

More important, the stream of distractions at home, I found, drained my emotional energy, which is a much more important deterrent for me than lack of physical energy, both for my desire to be outside and *especially* for my

desire to go into my studio. Hence, since class ended in late fall, there lay idle my collections of colored and patterned papers, background boards, and dozens of types of two- and three-dimensional stuff that are essential for some works.

But now with distractions at home much moderated, spring and more sun clearly on the way, a new class providing stimulation and socialization, my desire to spend hours in my studio is revived. And I am delighted.

Also, now that winter's snows are likely behind us, RAL is coming to life again.

The program for our membership meeting April 2 will be a critique of members' artwork. You should bring a work in progress or other work you would like feedback on, particularly if you are considering entering the piece in the May juried show.

Also, in April as you will see below in this Newsletter, the Board is requesting that all of you complete a short questionnaire not only about your participation in RAL but also your recommendations for RAL activities you personally would enjoy having more but also new RAL activities you would like introduced.

Your Board of Directors is very eager to learn what might improve RAL's program for you personally. Also, the Board must assess the interest you and other RAL members have in helping to develop and run RAL activities, new and existing. The questionnaire is the work of Emily Pearce, who runs the show committee, with suggestions and encouragement from other Board members.

Studying your responses will be a primary focus of the Board this spring and next fall. Your responding *as completely as you can* will be vital for RAL's future programming. Please, everyone, take the time to respond. We need your help, now.

RAL Juried Member Art Show GLENVIEW MANSION

MAY 3, 2015 – MAY 29, 2015

Judge: Gavin Glakas will be our juror for the May Member Show. He grew up in Bethesda, Maryland and is a portrait and figure artist as well as landscape painter. He has won numerous honors for his artwork, including awards from the Portrait Society of America and the Butler Institute of American Art. His paintings have been featured in American Art Collector, International Artist among others, and exhibited in museums and galleries throughout the country. Gavin paints full time and also teaches figure painting and drawing at the Yellow Barn Studio in Glen Echo. His scheduled gallery walk-through is on Thursday, May 7, at 6:30 PM .

Eligibility and rules: Each member in good standing may enter two works. There is a \$5 entry fee, which will be waived if you volunteer for the show. The maximum length of any framed side is 60 inches. Only **original** works securely framed with hanging wire are acceptable. The entries must have been completed within the last two years and may not have been exhibited previously in a RAL Member Show. No photographs, no reproductions, no giclées and no wet canvases are allowed. A work having multiple framed parts must meet the two works per member criteria. Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted. RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show. Artist's signature on the Show Agreement also constitutes a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price to the City of Rockville for works sold during the show.

Categories:

- Oils and acrylics
- Watercolors
- Pastels, drawings, and hand pulled prints
- Mixed media, collage, experimental, and original computer-generated art
- Sculpture and ceramics

Awards:

- Best in Show (cash and ribbon)
- First, Second and Third in all categories (cash and ribbons)
- Honorable Mention at the judge's discretion (ribbons)

Delivery: Tuesday, April 28 , Noon - 2 PM and 5 – 7 PM. Register and deliver your work to the second floor Glenview Mansion Art Gallery, Rockville Civic Center. On Wednesday, April 29, please phone the pickup hotline after 2 PM, **240-314-8682**, to see if your work was juried into the show. If your number is listed then you or your designee must pick up your work on Thursday, April 30, Noon -2:00 PM and 5:00 – 7:00 PM.

Gallery Walk Through: Thursday, May 7, at 6.30 PM.

Reception: Sunday, May 3, from 1:30-3:30 PM. Presentation of awards at 2 PM. Light refreshments to follow.

Final Pick Up: Monday, June 1, 2015, Noon – 2 PM and 5-7 PM. Your work must be picked up. Please have your designee pick up your work if necessary. Any work left after Wednesday noon will not be insured. There is no storage available.

Sales: The Glenview Mansion staff will manage art sales. Artist's signature on the Show Agreement also constitutes a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price to the City of Rockville for works sold during the show.

We need volunteers to help register, move, hang, type, and release entries. Please check your schedules and volunteer. It takes a lot of manpower to put this show together. The \$5 entry fee will be waived if you volunteer for the show.

Critique by Penny Kritt Creating Creativity!



In April and May, let's examine how to get your creative juices flowing. This month we'll look at being spontaneous. In May, we'll look at a more structured approach.

Having done many presentations on creativity, I've learned that just telling people to "let go, be free and uninhibited" won't work for the kind of folks who think they need that kind of class! Either you don't have a clue where to start or there are so many possibilities that you just can't pick one.

Here are some parameters to give you a starting point.

The Guidelines:

1. This won't take more than an hour. *Unless you're on a roll and don't want to stop!*
2. This won't cost more than \$10. *Unless you decide you want to use more objects, tools, a larger format, etc. That's where you're individuality drives the process.*
3. You can work on paper or canvas, as long as it's at least 11 x 16 inches. *Work large enough that you have room to experiment, so bigger is always better.*
4. No starting over. *Just go for it!*

Supplies:

1. Black, yellow and blue or turquoise paints. *You can use other colors as well. Use any kind of paint (watercolor, acrylic or oil). Use paint straight out of the tube – including watercolor paint – with no water or medium to thin it out.*

2. Plastic knife, spoon and fork – use disposable ones from a fast food restaurant. *Use these to spread paint. Or apply the paint with your (gloved!) hands, a spatula or anything – except a paint brush!*
3. Acrylic metallic paint. *Folk Art makes a large variety of metallic paints that also come in reds, greens and blues. Bottles cost about \$2.00 at any local craft store. Give your work a little bling!*
4. Something with texture that can be pressed into the paint. *Use a piece of metal screen, some lace, the tread on an old athletic shoe, a sponge, etc.*
5. Three different sized circular objects that will be attached to your creation. *Buttons, a tinfoil pie pan, bangle bracelets, etc. Use glue, staples, sticky-backed velcro or any method to attach these objects.*

Directions:

1. Put all the above items on a work table.
2. Look at your watch, you've got an hour.
3. Use them all.

There, that's it, the whole ball of wax!

OK, I bet you're stumped now! What should you do with all this stuff? Plastic silverware to spread paint – *how will that work?* Realism or abstraction? I CAN HEAR THE PANIC ALREADY!!!!!!

But this torture will only last an hour. SO JUST DO IT! When you're done, send a photo of it to pennykritt@aol.com.

Or face the consequences! Oh, dear, consequences! What consequences???? Not *more* pressure!

I've been writing this column for years now, and I need some feedback! I'll be looking for at least three people from RAL to provide me photos, proof that someone really reads my column. If I don't get at least three responses, I might not do the May column that will explain a detailed and structured way to create a composition...a complete opposite of all the haphazard serendipity of this month's approach.

Are YOU willing to be the obstacle that prevents me from doing more articles? *I thought not!*





- Painting & drawing techniques, color stick applications, mark making
- The creative process, ideas and concepts

Format: Lecture and demonstrations: We will experiment with several types of papers and scrolls. Introduce new tools (mark making), stamps, soft lead pencils, charcoal, rubber tipped tools, stencils, plastic grid material, bubble wrap in a variety of sizes, soft kitchen utensils, scrapers, clay-modeling tools, etc. We will do additive and subtractive processes, and try various tools and plate temperatures in order to become comfortable with the many possibilities. All this will include plenty of time to paint! Each day we will have Q & A time and a critique of the work.

GLENVIEW MANSION CONFERENCE ROOM SHOWS

You can show your artwork in Glenview Mansion for one month if you have received a 1st, 2nd, 3rd or honorable mention award in an RAL juried show. Starting in 2013, artists may have both rooms to exhibit in if a second artist doesn't sign up for the same month within two months of the show's start date; otherwise they will have one room. The receptions at Glenview mansion are 1:30-3:30 pm, on the Sunday after hanging! Preferred drop-off and pick-up times for Glenview Shows are from 9 am to 12 noon. Note: please contact the mansion management ahead of time if you wish to modify the drop-off or pick-up times.

For artwork delivery at the Glenview Mansion, please be prepared to unwrap your work and take the wrappings with you - there is no room to store packing materials at the Mansion. Please bring pliers (needle nose are easy to work with). There is no one to help move artwork from your vehicle to the conference rooms, however, you may use the hand truck that is at the Mansion. You are responsible for hanging your own artwork with help from the Mansion staff. If you have not made labels for your work, please fill out the RAL cards that will be available when you bring your work to the conference room. If you print your own, they should be on card stock. Please do not use the sticky Avery labels, unless you adhere them to foam core or card stock.

If you are unavailable on the appropriate date for pickup, please arrange with someone to pickup for you. There is no room to store your artwork at the Mansion after it comes down.

Drop off/pickups are Mondays (unless **Monday** is a holiday).
