Our judge, Christine Lashley devoted much time to ensure the pieces selected for the show will look great together and make for a beautiful exhibition.

Now that she has made the hard choice of which works will be in our show, she is undertaking the even harder job of determining which pieces deserve special recognition via awards.

Many thanks to all artists who have taken a risk by entering our juried show with such beautiful and thoughtful work.

I am in awe of our artists with their creativity, artistic expression, and the quality of their work. As a reminder, the work included in the show will be on display virtually and in the Glenview Mansion Art Gallery opening on December 5, 2021.

There will be a "meet the artists" event on December 5. We plan to hand out awards to our recognized artists at 2:30 pm that afternoon.

Those artists unable to attend will have their awards mailed to them.

Our judge Christine Lashley will lead us in an awards Zoom on Thursday, December 9th beginning at 7:00 pm.

We had a terrific presentation from Dr. Lorena Bradford and her National Gallery of Art program "The Art of Looking." I was amazed at how being calm and investing time to deeply view a work of art leads to immeasurable more understanding and appreciation of the piece (speaking for myself and hopefully others). I was heartened to hear from one member who used this approach recently at Glenstone Museum making the visit even more rewarding. I look forward to hearing more from Dr. Bradford in the future and more on "The Art of Looking" experience at the NGA and elsewhere.

We have an impressive schedule of presentations for next winter and early spring. Many thanks to members Sarah Sohraby and Richard Fisher for researching and arranging these upcoming sessions. Speakers will be on Zoom as we recover from the pandemic. I look forward to presentations in person later next year and my fingers are crossed.

We have a beautiful show on display at Glenview Mansion (and virtually) right now and I hope you will find the time to view it. Our "For Love of Glenview" exhibit was originally a virtual only show. And we have taken a large piece of that show and coupled it with the work of five award winning artists for this current show. Artists Susan Dunnell, Stephanie Gustafson, Susan Moses, Suzanne Frisby and Norda Kitrie have a selection of their pieces on display along with the Love of Glenview pieces. Please see it and you will be glad you did.

Fall is ending and shorter days and longer evenings are upon us. While I often enjoy painting in Plein Air, I find myself quite productive in the studio. I look forward to creating new work in the cooler seasons and find inspiration in the fall colors that find their way into my winter work. Not to mention the inspiration I have gotten from the entries to our Winter Juried Show.


October 28 - November 24: For Love of Glenview and 5 Featured RAL Artists Exhibit

Thank you for entering our show and please consider future show opportunities offered to our members.

- 1. You will need to agree to the terms of *the show agreement* (found in the show call in the Oct. and Nov.newsletters on our website) **before your work** can be displayed at Glenview. This agreement will be sent to the email you provided on your entry form on November 16 and please read and reply to that email.
- There is a \$10 show fee, per accepted artist (not per piece). You may pay this on http://www.rockvilleartleague.org by clicking on the show fee button. Or you may mail a check written to Rockville Art League to treasurer: Rob Gale, 108 W. Argyle St. Rockville, MD 20850
- 3. **All 2-dimensional work** *must be framed, gallery wrapped or professionally finished*, securely wired. Only original works, framed securely with hanging

- wire, are acceptable. If submitting unframed canvas, *edges must be painted or finished*. No wet canvases allowed.
- 4. Any changes to the label information *PLEASE* send by Monday, Nov. 22.

Important dates:

- Monday, November 29, 10:00am-1:00pm, delivery of artwork.
- Sunday, December 5, 1:30-3:30pm: please join us to "Meet the Artists" and see the show. Invite your friends and neighbors. Note: we continue to follow the City of Rockville's guidance for health and safety.
- Tuesday, January 18, 10:00am-1:00pm, pick up of artwork.

The virtual show will also be posted on our website prior to the opening. Please share it with your friends, family, and community. It will be a beautiful show.

On Thursday, December 9, 7:00PM on Zoom Christine Lashley will discuss her choices for the award-winning pieces. Please support your fellow artists by attending. We plan to record this. The link will be sent out a few days prior.






